The science of Fire

Fire is a result of a chemical reaction between heat, fuel and oxygen. The key to preventing fires is to understand what fire is and how it starts. As long as all three components are readily available, a fire can continue to burn and potentially grow. Remove any one of the components or stop the chemical reaction and the fire will go out. Fire safety at the most basic level is ensuring these three components never have the opportunity to come together to create a fire hazard. Preventing Fires "101"

Heat can come from many items around the home. Stove tops, fireplaces, and candles are some obvious sources, but cigarette butts, electrical chargers and electric motors can also generate enough heat to start a fire. Although most think of gasoline as fuel, anything that burns such as soil, mulch and plastics can also burn. Protect yourself by keeping these combustible items a safe distance away from heat sources. Oxygen is the last component needed for a fire to burn. While oxygen may be readily around us and hard to control, we should know that by removing it we can also extinguish a fire. A good example of this is sliding a lid on a stove top grease fire can remove the oxygen and extinguish the fire. Consider purchasing several fire extinguishers and make sure they're conveniently located where you'll have quick and easy access to them. Flower Bed Tips

With Spring just around the corner, expect landscapers to start edging, weeding and mulching flower beds. If you prefer to tackle this chore on your own, be sure to install reflectors where their crew can easily spot them to skip the service. We'd also like to take this opportunity to remind folks to plant things sensibly. Consider how large plants and trees will grow over their lifetime before planting near buildings, foundations, fences and utilities. Remember the amount of canopy you see above is a good indication of the roots that will form below. Tree roots can also be a big issue with sewer lines if they find their way in and create an obstruction. With so many mature trees, the association does not have resources allocated for routine pruning of personal trees, so keep that in mind when making your selections. Lastly, be sure to always get prior Board approval before planting anything in the ground.

Please remember that if you have a satellite dish mounted on a deck or handrail, now is the time to get it moved. It will not be possible to install any dishes directly onto the new decks, so contact your providers and have them talk to our office about possible alternative mounting locations. Units with decks above will need to remove items stored in lower level sheds. Upper units will need to remove items stored on top of decks. At the current pace and weather permitting decks are being completed in less than a weeks time, so hopefully the inconvenience will be brief!
